

I listened with interest to an interview with Princess Anne ahead of the coronation, as she explained her understanding of the importance and relevance of the 'crown' today. She described the fast pace, changing fashions and turbulence of the modern world saying that the monarchy, through its tradition provided much needed stability and certainty.

Tradition is, undoubtedly, a very important element in underpinning a particular culture.

Traditionally for Catholics, May is the month of devotion to Mary, Our Blessed Lady. Indeed, there was a time when Catholics took part in May processions. (one still takes place in Batley). Many statues will feature Our Lady wearing a crown. She is referred to as the Queen of the May and older readers will remember a beautiful hymn describing her in these terms (further reference to blossom in this too).

Last year, I saw a guy shopping and was struck by his tattoo of the Virgin Mary carrying lilies. Admiring the artwork, I asked him about it. He said it was because his mum, who had passed away, had a devotion to Mary. He had the tattoo as a reminder of his mum's faith.

McAuley has a proud tradition built on clear values over a number of years. All the headteachers who have served McAuley over the last 40 years have been merely custodians of these values.

It is therefore, timely that this was sent to all staff this week.
